

Billardiera cymosa **Sweet Apple Berry**







(Seeds of South Australia)

Form: Medium shrub

Height: 1-2 m

Spread: 1-4 m

Flowers: Mauve

Type: Tubular

Flowering time: Spring, Summer

Germination rate: 4 to 8 weeks

Ecological functions:



Soils: sand, clay or loam; acidic, alkaline or neutral

Seed collecting: mature fruits are maroon break up seeds that are held firmly within the capsule.

Seed treatment: none

Sowing requirements: sow on top of damp soil and cover with a layer of gravel. Sow in late Winter to early spring. Sow in full sun, not under shadecloth.

Position: full sun, part shade.

Supplementary watering: minimal

Uses: a non-aggressive climber for parks and reserves, useful over fences or embankments amongst native vegetation. Low allergen and decorative flowers. Indigenous peoples ate the fruit raw or sun-dried like sultanas.

Notes: becomes shrubby if planted in open
