Form: *Ground cover* **Height:** *0.1 – 0.2 m* **Spread:** *0.3 – 0.6 m* **Flowers:** *Pink* **Type:** *Funnel* **Flowering time:** *Spring, Summer*

Ecological functions:  

Soils: *sand, clay or loam; alkaline*

Germination rate: *2 to 4 weeks*

Seed collecting: collect mature seeds that have turned brown. Wear gloves. Leave seeds in sun to further dry. Capsules will then split to release seeds.

Seed treatment: place on a tray and dry heat in oven at 60 degrees for 30 minutes.

Sowing requirements: cover with 2 mm of damp soil and firm gently. Then cover with a layer of gravel. Sow in late Spring-Summer.

Position: full sun

Supplementary watering: minimal

Uses: native twining ground cover which could be incorporated into native landscapes, parks and reserves. Used as a bush food by Indigenous peoples. Food host to Meadow Argus (*Junonia villida calybe*).

Notes: grows from cuttings.
