

Hardenbergia violacea **Native Wisteria**









(Taylor, R, Seeds of South Australia)

Form: Low shrub or Climber **Height:** 0.4 – 0.5 m

Flowers: Purple

Type: Pea

Flowering time: Spring, Winter

Ecological functions:





Soils: sand, clay or loam; acidic, alkaline or neutral

Germination rate: 4 to 6 weeks

Seed collecting: pods can be picked off by gloved hands when they mature to be a brown colour. Place in warm area to dry.

Seed treatment: Place seed into a container with hot NOT BOILING water from the tap. Soak immediately.

Sowing requirements: cover seed to its own depth with damp soil and firm gently. Then cover with a layer of gravel. Sow in Summer.

Position: full sun

Supplementary watering: minimal

Uses: a vigorous small shrub or climber. Can be planted singly in mixed beds, wider verges and roundabouts, or mass planted as an effective ground or fence cover. Food source of Common Grass-blue (Zizina otis labradus).

Notes: responds well to hard pruning to improve shape and form.
