



Arthropodium strictum

Chocolate Lily

Form: *Sedge or Flax*

Height: 0.2 – 0.3 m

Spread: up to 0.2 m

Flowers: Mauve

Type: Star

Flowering time: Summer

Ecological functions:



Soils: sand, clay or loam; alkaline, acidic or neutral

Germination rate: 2 to 6 weeks

Seed collecting: collect mature capsules, those that are turning a pale straw colour and contain black seeds. Collect individual capsules or break off the whole spike.

Seed treatment: none

Sowing requirements: cover seed to its own depth with damp soil and firm gently. Then cover with a layer of gravel. Sow in full sun, not under shade cloth. Sow in Autumn.

Position: full sun

Supplementary watering: minimal

Uses: a small delicate native lily with distinctive scent of chocolate on a warm day. Excellent species for mass plantings. Tubers are used for food by Indigenous peoples.

Notes: Propagate from seed or by division. This species has a clumping habit.
