

Austrostipa elegantissima Elegant Spear-grass

Form: *grass clumping*

Height: 1-2 m

Spread: up to 1 m

Flowers: --

Type: *Grass panicle*

Flowering time: Spring, Summer

Ecological functions:









Soils: sand, clay or loam; alkaline or neutral

Germination rate: 2 to 4 weeks

Seed collecting: gently strip the seeds off the mature fruiting spike. Mature seeds are brown and will come off easily.

Seed treatment: none

Sowing requirements: push the seed points into the soil and firm gently. Then cover with a layer of gravel. Sow in Autumn.

Position: full sun

Supplementary watering: minimal

Uses: an ornamental tufting perennial for mixed native landscapes, borders, and wider verges. Food host to Common Brown (*Heteronympha merope merope*) caterpillars.

Notes: Austrostipa tends to grow in clumps. Do not thin out.
