Form: *Low Shrub*

Height: *1 - 1.5 m*

Spread: *1 - 2 m*

Flowers: *Pink*

Type: *Spider/Clustered*

Flowering time: *Spring, Winter*

Ecological functions:



Soils: *Sand or loam; acidic, alkaline, neutral*

Germination rate: *Unknown*

Seed collecting: Collect seeds from December to April. To collect mature seeds, tie collection bags around branchlets to catch them or sieve material from underneath the plant.

Seed treatment: None.

Sowing requirements: Unknown.

Lavender Grevillea can be propagated from soft tip cuttings taken in winter or early spring. Dip cuttings (10 cm long) into rooting hormone and place into sand or pumice, watering sparingly. Place cuttings in a warm area away from direct sunlight.

Position: Full sun.

Supplementary watering: Minimal.

Uses: A highly ornamental plant. Plant as a single specimen in a mixed native planting arrangement or grouped as an informal hedge or barrier. It is suitable for rockeries, as a groundcover and large pots and containers. Grevillea responds well to pruning.

Notes: Planting in streets or roads requires written approval. Do not plant closer than 2 metres to any sewer main or connection.
